TRINITY VILLAGE FOCUS - HENRY WOOD HALL



Henry Wood Hall, a former church turned orchestral rehearsal and recording studio in Trinity Church Square, boasts a rich history dating back to its construction in 1823–24. It was renamed in 1975 after the esteemed conductor Sir Henry Wood, an English conductor best known for his association with London's annual series of promenade concerts, informally known as the 'Proms'. It subsequently became a beacon for musical excellence.

Hosting renowned orchestras like the St Petersburg Philharmonic and the Japan Philharmonic, Henry Wood Hall has cemented its status as a premier venue for recordings and rehearsals.

The Corporation of Trinity House will be hosting a 'Meet & Greet' event on the afternoon of 16 May with local residents and the Corporation's Deputy Master, highlighting the Hall's continued status as an iconic location for the Corporation and residents of Trinity Village alike. LOCAL HIGHLIGHT - WHITE CUBE

White Cube is a contemporary art gallery, founded by Jay Jopling in 1993. It is known for its artist-led approach, nurturing some of the most influential and respected artists of our time, including Luc Tuymans, Hiroshi Sugimoto and Julie Mehretu. Its galleries span three continents, residing in major cities such as New York, Paris, Hong Kong and Seoul.

Stop by its London counterpart on Bermondsey Street to peruse Georg Baselitz's latest solo exhibition, *A Confession of My Sins*, running until 16 June 2024. Baselitz, 86, presents large-scale paintings and works on paper as he harks back to the last six and a half decades of his craft, meditating on his life-long inspirations.

Tracey Emin's residency takes place in September this year, presenting us with *I followed you to the end*. Coinciding with Frieze art fair, Emin's works will usurp the Bermondsey gallery space with unseen paintings, works on paper and an impressive bronze sculpture. Emin's artistically primal and viscerally expressive style makes for an emotive viewing experience, as she explores and shares her confessional practice.

MAINTENANCE UPDATES

Unfortunately there has been a recent spate of burglaries across the estate. Residents are reminded to secure their homes, making sure all locks installed in homes are checked and secured as appropriate, windows should not be left open unattended, and we urge tenants not to buzz people into the building unless they know them. Please also remove any valuables from sight through windows and ensure keys are hidden and not in plain sight.
